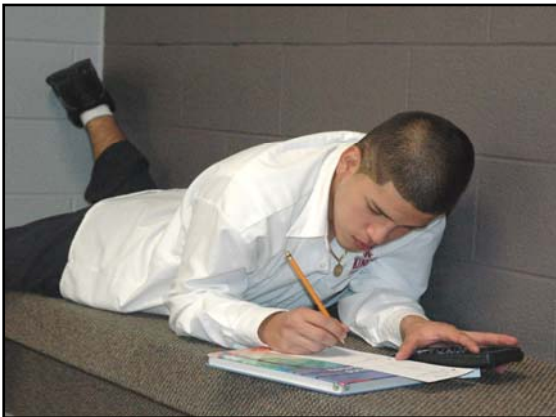

ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL LITERACY TEST FOR GRADE 10

The date for the Grade 10 Literacy Test is Thursday, March 29. The test is written in two sessions during the morning and students will continue with regular classes until the end of the day. On Tuesday, March 27, 2007 students will attend a final briefing session during school time to explain the arrangements and to answer questions. The results of the practice test have been given to each student. Students have a checklist with their results and have made notes to themselves for their preparation. **Please ask your son or daughter to share their insights with you and discuss how they will approach their final preparation.** It is important that students are familiar with the information on the Ministry web site <http://www.eqao.com/categories/home.aspx?Lang=E>. Follow the links to *Parent Resources* and also *Student Resources*. Mr. Ford has created a conference page on First Class called *Gr. 10 Literacy Advice* for students taking the test. Check the postings regularly for more links and sample tests, with hints and suggested strategies. You might like to print out some of the sheets and work through them before the test. Mr. Ford invites students to contact him for more information. There are help sessions in the Learning Commons every day during Lunch. Take advantage of these sessions to ensure your success!

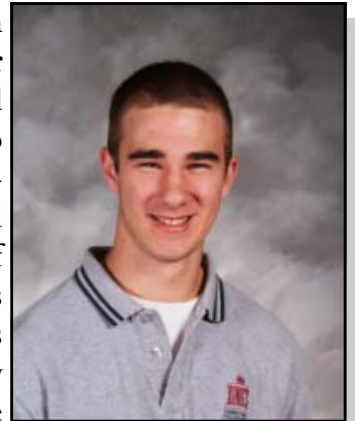
PRAYER POLE
