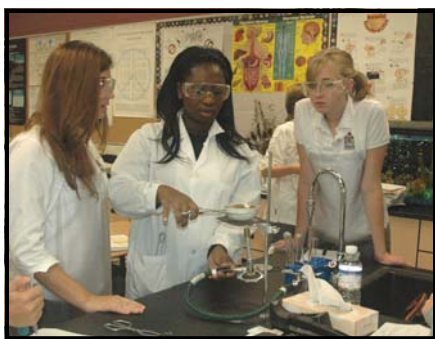
COMMUNITY BADMINTON

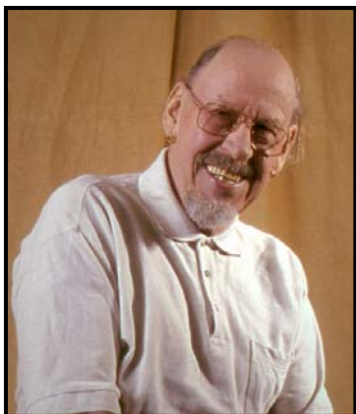

AN EVENING OF THE ARTS

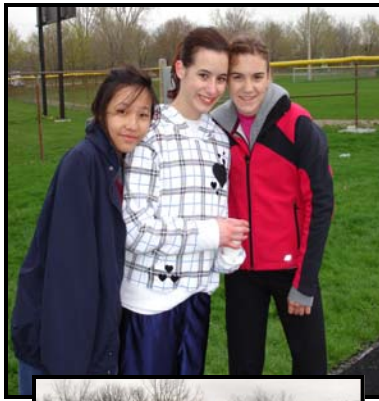

TO KING'S YOUNG LADIES AND PARENTS...

We are asking for the cooperation of everyone as we deal with the issue of the length of the skirts some girls are choosing to wear. The uniform guidelines state that, "when standing tall, the skirt length must reach to within four finger widths of the top of the kneecap". This guideline has not been followed by all of our students, which has created awkward moments for both staff and students. As with all uniform infractions, there are five options offered the student:

- Retrieve something more appropriate from your locker
- Borrow from a friend
- Phone home to request delivery of a proper uniform item
- Purchase from the school's used uniform inventory
- Remain in the office for the remainder of the day

Failure by students to respect our uniform policy borders on defiance. We request the cooperation of parents and students alike as we encourage our girls to live within the spirit of the King's policy. If the issue continues to be a problem, skirts will be removed from our list of acceptable uniform options. Thank-you to all the young ladies who have complied with this policy in the past and thank-you to parents, as always, for your continued support.
