LET'S GET ROLLING...

At a recent seminar with Dr. Karyn Gordon, she mentioned that one of the descriptors for this present generation is that they are committed to social justice, that they care deeply about global and communal issues.

When we consider how our students give, such a comment is easy to understand. A group of students regularly goes to the Olive Branch with Mr. Masengi. The Civics classes embraced the idea of raising funds for World Vision. And when we asked for volunteers for a "Food for Life" initiative, 20 students quickly stepped forward.

Another opportunity: Five local agencies are responding to a sad reality. Despite the fact that we live in a prosperous society, the local poverty rate is over 11%. For children of poverty, there is little opportunity to participate in physical activity. We would like to change that by providing children (or parents) and teens with bicycles, instructions on safety, helmets, locks, and repair kits. Each "package" costs \$150.00.

All students in Phys Ed classes are already aware of this simple, practical way to make a difference in somebody's life, but we want everyone to have the chance to participate. Wouldn't it be great to buy two bikes? Five? If every student brought in \$5.00, we could buy 12 bikes. We welcome all contributions! We will collect donations until Wednesday, May 27.

THE RECESSION IS REAL (FOR SOME)

This year the Board of Directors has gladly distributed \$197,000 in tuition assistance bursaries to 41 families as our way of sharing together the pain of the recession. As could be expected, the number of requests for bursaries in various amounts is up by 30% over previous years. Please respond to this appeal, whether you are a golfer or not. ENROLMENT FOR SEPTEMBER IS UP 10%

I am sure you will be pleased to know that our enrolment is up by 10% compared to the same time last year. As of today, 88 new students are enrolled. By grade, in ascending order. The numbers are 62, 102, 116 and 90 students for Grade 12 - with another 20 admissions applications in process. This good news is worthy of thanksgiving to our God who continues to bless beyond our predictions earlier this year.

With a good maintenance program, the instruments will be in performance condition for at least seven years before requiring replacement. - Teacher-escorted trips to the bathroom are only permitted in very urgent situations.
- Arrive early. Any student who arrives late must meet with an administrator in order to receive permission to enter the exam room.
- Enter and leave the exam room quietly. Respect other exam writers by remaining quiet in the halls.
